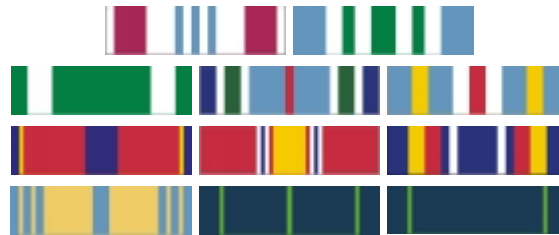

- Navy & Marine Corps Commendation Medal. Heroic or meritorious achievement or service.
- Joint Service Achievement Medal. The JSAM shall be awarded only to members of the Armed Forces of the United States below the grade of O-6 who distinguished themselves by outstanding performance of duty and meritorious achievement while serving with a Joint Activity.
- Joint Meritorious Unit Commendation Ribbon. The Joint Meritorious Unit Award is awarded to Joint Activities of the Armed Forces of the United States which have distinguished themselves by exceptionally meritorious achievement or service in pursuit of joint military missions of great significance.
- Naval Reserve Meritorious Service Medal. Outstanding performance and conduct during 4 years of service in the Naval Reserve.
- National Defense Service Medal. Any honorable active duty service during specified periods. Bronze Star Device for 2nd award.
- Global War on Terrorism Service Medal. Awarded to soldiers who have participated in or served in support of Global War on Terrorism Operations on or after 11 September 2001.
